Read Proverbs 19:11

How can you respond to an offensive statement from someone without reacting in kind?

Give Humility To The World Around You - in reality, it's not about us. It's about Jesus, and we're to be His ambassadors. We can't do this without humility.

Read 2 Corinthians 5:19-20, Colossians 3:12

If someone is arrogant in their opinion, do people even care if they're right?
