Notice lesus already was cooking the fish. Why do you suppose?

3. Why is Peter singled out here?

Read John 21:16,17

- 4. What does the question Do you love me more than "these" mean?
 - a. Does it mean more than the other disciples? What do you think?
 - b. Is it possible that He is asking Peter to announce Christ's supremacy?

There are two types of love in the bible. The Greek language contains even more.

Phileo is more emotional love

Agape is more love of choice.

Discuss these two concepts and the differences. See the section below

Peter never answered Jesus questions. Do you Agape me?
